

ASSEMBLING THE DRAGON KING MODEL

Before assembling your Dragon King model study the construction diagram. Carefully remove all the parts from the sprues using a sharp modelling knife. Remove any plastic mould lines or injection markings with an emery board or sharp knife. We recommend gluing the parts together with Citadel polystyrene cement.

Before following the stages below it is a good idea to do a 'dry run' first, to see how the parts fit in relation to each other.

Stage 1:

Glue together the two halves of the dragon's body, making sure the separate spine section is in place first, then put to one side to dry.

Stage 2:

The tail and lower jaw parts may now be glued onto the body. Assemble the dragon's head as illustrated and once dry, glue to the end of the neck.

Stage 3:

Glue the feet and legs together, attach to the main body, then glue the base into place.

Stage 4:

Finally, glue both wings and upper arms to complete the kit.




SAFETY NOTE: When using a sharp modelling knife always make cuts away from yourself and your fingers! When using Citadel glue, follow the instructions on the label carefully.


ASSEMBLING THE DRAGON'S TOWER

Stage 1:


Start off with the central column. Be sure to slot in tabs 'A' and 'B' first, then assemble the base of the column as shown in the diagram opposite. Follow the diagram carefully to make a sturdy support for the three floors and the Dragon King model.

Stage 3:

Once the floors are in place, slide in the two wall sections as shown. The solid wall section without any doorway spaces goes on the side of the tower that has the stair spaces.




Stage 4:

Finally, position the Dragon King model securely onto the top of the tower and place the completed model in the centre of the Talisman board.

Stage 2:

Next add the floors to the column. These drop over the top of the column and lock into place. Start with the largest and put the smallest one on last.
